

I did the fashion illustration course last February, and we learned how to perform basic sketching, beginning with the head and progressing to drawing stick to flesh figures. We learned 8 head figures with front, back, and side poses, as well as 9 and 10 head figures. I was having problems drawing the basic sketches. I improved my basic sketching skills with the guidance of our instructor. We were taught how to sketch fashion croquis in various poses and learned to sketch outfits in many styles, such as classic, romantic, stylish and Goth.

We sketched our outfits on fashion models in various styles using color pencils, collage techniques, marker pens, oil pastels, charcoal, and watercolor. We also learned how to design diverse silhouettes, such as waistlines, sleeves, collars, pockets, necklines, and trousers, as well as basic and advanced sketches of blouses, skirts, pants, lingerie, and jackets. Course Details:

A career as a fashion illustrator provides you with the opportunity to combine your passion and talent for drawing with fashion. This course introduces the basic skills adopted by professional illustrators working in creative industries today, with an emphasis on fashion and artistic practice. Illustrators work for fashion brands, graphic design companies, magazines, events and exhibitions, on books and editorials, trend books and advertising, and respond to the growing demand in the digital world for illustration used in blogs, Pinterest etc. Students learn contemporary fashion illustrator skills and are encouraged to develop an individual style and gain knowledge of past and current illustration methods used in the fashion industry.


