THE BUSINESS CUP CHALLENGE



he Business Cup Challenge (BCC) hosted by Curtin University is a distinctive platform that drives the brightest business ideas emerging from the finest students throughout the Country. Introduced in 2011 by Transnational Academic Group, through its partner schools, BCC has increased in popularity over the years.

In this competition, students are required to review and implement real-life business plans, analyze crucial business situations, and present a case to an academic and professional panel.

University students get the opportunity to work as part of a team, in a competitive environment, using their critical thinking and problem-solving skills and business acumen.

This year the Business Cup Challenge focused on Sustainability and its use as the underlying theme in businesses. The Sustainable Development Goals established by the United Nations for the world are being implemented through government regulation, corporate action, and individual efforts. Many investors, and therefore investment companies, are now requiring companies to provide ESG reports (Environmental, Social, and Governance) every quarter and will only invest in companies that are moving in a sustainable direction.

The contest consisted of a preliminary round wherein case studies were issued online over 2-3 weeks. Teams were given one week to solve the case and submit their answers to earn a cumulative score which will be reflected on the leaderboard.





The top five teams were allowed to progress into the finale directly. Team Vivid consisting of 5 participants from the Al Zahia campus won a direct entry into the Grand Finale with their stunning case study solution to help resolve SDG 1 – No Poverty!

After the Preliminary Round, the remaining teams were allowed to enter the Elevator Pitch Round, allowing the low-scoring teams to progress to the finale. At the Elevator Pitch, Reyha Roa from Team Corporate Crew and Nehal Soni representing Team All Stars acquired the highest score, and the love and cheer of the audience, sliding into the Grand Finale.

All scores returned to zero on the day of the finale and the participants once again contested a new case study and pitched solutions to help curb SDGs 2 and 4 – Quality Education and No Hunger. This year's Business Cup Challenge, we believe, provided students a platform to begin to think sustainably so that, as the leaders of tomorrow, they can bring the world into a new age of sustainable living.




WESTFORD IS HOME TO A DIVERSE COMMUNITY
